Title: Porcher family papers, 1740-1967 (bulk 19th century)

Description: Ca. 3 linear ft.

Biographical/Historical Note: Berkeley County and Charleston, S.C. family descended from Isaac Porcher (1660-1727), a native of France. His grandson, Peter Porcher (1726-1781) of Peru Plantation, was the father of Thomas Porcher (1766-1835) and Samuel Porcher (1768-1851). Thomas Porcher (1766-1835) of Ophir Plantation was the father of fourteen children including Charlotte Porcher (b. 1794), Thomas Porcher (1796-1843), Anna Maria Porcher (b. 1811), Peter Cordes Porcher (1814-1853), and William Porcher (1800-1833). William Porcher (1800-1833) was the father of Dr. Francis Peyre Porcher (1824-1895), whose children included Walter Peyre Porcher (1858-1919), Virginia Leigh Porcher (1866-1940), Anne Alston Porcher (1882-1970), and Louise de Cherigny Porcher. Samuel Peyre (1715-1758) is related to the Porcher family through Francis Peyre Porcher's mother Isabella Sarah Peyre Porcher (1803-1890).

Scope and content: Papers consist of correspondence, writings, land and legal papers, commonplace books, genealogical material, school papers, estate records, and other items. Included are the papers of Frederick A. Porcher (1809-1888), Walter Peyre Porcher (1858-1919), Francis Peyre Porcher (1824-1893), and Virginia Leigh Porcher (1866-1940), and a commonplace book of Samuel Peyre (1715-1758).

Papers of Anne Alston Porcher consist of diaries, notebooks, and a scrapbook. Diaries (1898-1932) concern Porcher's life at Pinopolis (S.C.), Flat Rock (N.C.), Rock Hill (S.C.), Greenville (S.C.), as a student at Winthrop College, and her friends, family, and social life. Included is a travel diary (1907) of Porcher's trip to Europe which also contains drawings, clippings, letters, photographs, postcards, and other mementos. A notebook (1906-1907) contains a travel itinerary and notes on expenses and places of interest. Another notebook (1909) contains notes on palmistry and includes clippings with diagrams of palm lines. Scrapbook (1893) mostly contains prints and engravings depicting landscapes, famous persons, domestic and religious scenes, horses, and other subjects; there are also pencil drawings and watercolor paintings.

Papers (1936-1967) of Louise de Cherigny Porcher mainly consist of notebooks, photocopies of clippings, lists, notes, photographs, advertisements, and other items pertaining to silverware, china, and silversmiths of Charleston, S.C.

Scrapbook (1872) regarding the death tributes of Francis James Porcher. Microscopic studies of Julius T. Porcher.

Charleston historian. Correspondence of Frederick A. Porcher's family. Letters (1862-1865) mostly from Frederick A. Porcher in Charleston or Abbeville to his wife, Caroline S. Porcher, regarding the Civil War, personal matters, guard duty in Charleston, the local and national military and political situations, and the College and Charleston. Other letters (1865-1922) of Frederick A. Porcher, Clelia P. Missroon, Peter Porcher and other family members. Letter (5/25/1865) to Clelia Porcher from her cousin regarding the Yankee occupation at Otranto plantation, Berkeley Co. Also copies regarding war deaths (1863-1864) of Edwin C. Dubose, Clarence Palmer and Dubose Snowden. Muniments of Frederick A. Porcher (1831-1870).

Charleston historian. Memoir of Frederick A. Porcher (1859) regarding childhood on Cedar Springs plantation, Berkeley Co. and his summer home, Pineville. Reminiscences of his education at Yale and elsewhere, his life in politics, as a planter, his travels abroad and his teaching at the College of Charleston. Holograph version with Chapter 12 in typescript.

Writings, 1857- ca. 1880. 4 items.

Charleston historian. Historical writings of Frederick A. Porcher including "A History of the Administration of D.H. Chamberlain, the last Radical Governor of SC" read before the SC Historical Society regarding construction politics in SC, approx 200 pgs. Also essays on John C. Calhoun, "A History of the Santee Canal." (1875, see PAM 906); a synopsis of the lectures' delivered by Frederick A. Porcher at the College of Charleston (1859) on the Roman Empire; and an address before the SCHS (1857) regarding Western civilization and the history of SC.

Charleston historian. Writings and notes of Frederick A. Porcher. Notes on the Catawba Indian language. Diary (Feb-March, 1865) of Frederick A. Porcher's journey from Charleston to Abbeville. Commonplace book with poetry, philosophy, religion, politics and European history. Misc. writings on the price of gold and other subjects. Photographs of Frederick A. Porcher and others. Speech ms (1881) by William M. Porcher, some printed matter and a plat of Pineville (1826).

Abstract of title and other papers regarding Porcher land for 87 Broad Street and a South Bay Street property, Charleston and Mexico Plantation, Berkeley Co.

Commonplace book (ca. 1871-1919) of WPP with moral sayings, clippings, letters and other materials.

Charleston doctor and author. Notes, letters, biographical information, regarding Francis P. Porcher. Prescription books (1856-1861) of Francis P. Porcher's patients, including slaves. Commonplace book of Francis P. Porcher, student SC college (1843-1845) with notes and extracts from geography, philosophy, fiction, politics, criticism, and biographies. Family commonplace book (1874- ca.1903) of Francis P. Porcher, his wife Margaret Ward Porcher, and others with poetry, phrases in Latin and French, family letters, drawings, photographs, clipping and some genealogy. Letters, notes, printed matter, clippings regarding medical botany and useful properties from trees, shrubs, plants and other materials for medicine in southern forest for Francis P. Porcher's book, *Resources of the Southern Fields and Forests* (1869-1888). Correspondence with Henry W. Ravenel, Aiken (1874), and J.A. Mayes, Mayesville. Also much biographical material regarding Francis P. Porcher.

Charleston doctor. Letters (1801-1888) to the family of Francis P. Porcher. Correspondents include Isabelle S. Porcher, Sarraizan Winnsboro; Francis P. Porcher, Charleston, Columbia, New York, NY; Peter Cordes Porcher and H. Faber, Paris, France; Julian H. Porcher, Julia Leigh, New York, NY. Richmond, VA. Virginia Leigh Porcher and others regarding family matters, education, and the Civil War. Some letters from the North to the South during the War. Letter (1/11/1861) regarding coming of Republican rule. Francis P. Porcher (1864) to his songs, from Petersburg, VA regarding behavior for young men, manners, duties, and advice. Application letter (1866) of Francis P. Porcher for a faculty position at the Medical University of SC, Charleston. Letter regarding Peyre Family genealogy (n.d) Also letters to Francis Peyre regarding family matters (1801) and letter from Robert Y. Hayne to Col. William Dubose regarding Columbia Convention (1833).

Family letters. 1889-1961. Approx. 100 items

Charleston regent in the Mt. Vernon Ladies Association. Letters (1889-1961) to Virginia, Louise, Anne Porcher and others from Yates Snowden, Columbia; Julia P. Wickham, Moultrie Brailsford in France during World War I (1918); letters from Europe (1930) and other letters regarding property matter, family matters, and the Mt. Vernon Ladies Association.

11/319/1-13 Porcher, Virginia L., 1866-1940

Writings, 1896-1930's. ½ ft.

Charleston and regent of the Mt. Vernon Ladies Association. Non-fiction, poetry, fiction, and notes of Virginia L. Porcher. Subjects written on include tales of Charleston Houses, The Confederate Home, Charleston; Mary F. Wickham; botanist Thomas Walters; Robert Mills; Miniature exhibits; The preservation of spirituals, the French Huguenot Church, Charleston; Mt. Vernon Ladies Assn (1925-1933); Negro Character sketches; Journal of a European trip (1896), the Life of Isabella S. Porcher, Kenmore Plantation, Fredericksburg, VA, Asheville NC and blue-grass Kentucky.

Papers, 1898-1907. 7 items.

Winthrop College student. Journals of Anne A. Porcher from Pinopolis, Greenville, Winthrop College (1898-1904) and from Europe (1907) regarding travel, social life, education, personal and family matters. Memo books (n.d) regarding palmistry and Europe. Large scrapbook (11-310-6) of prints and places and prominent people from drawings ca. 1840's.
